

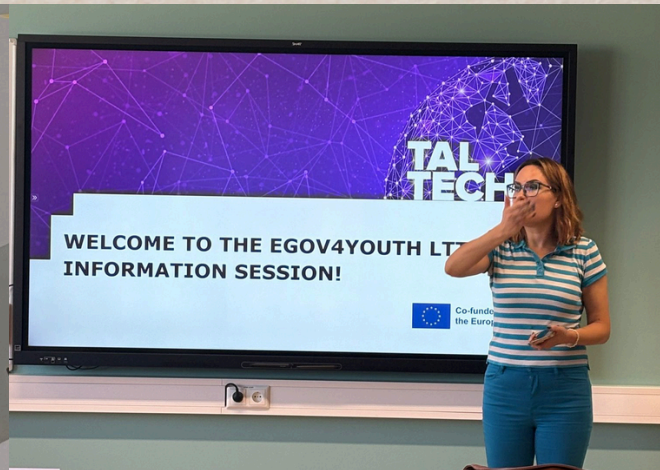

Transnational Learning, Teaching, and Training Activity (LTTA) in Tallinn, Estonia

From September 9–12, 2025, delegations from Italy, Cyprus, Bulgaria, Greece, Norway, and Estonia gathered in Tallinn, Estonia for the **E-Gov4Youth Transnational Learning, Teaching, and Training Activity (LTTA)** — hosted by our outstanding partners at **TalTech – Tallinn University of Technology**.

This four-day event represented a key step toward empowering young people to co-create digital solutions that strengthen democracy and collaboration between citizens and public institutions.

Participants had the opportunity to design and present a project that could lead to social impact into their countries, as well visited several stakeholders in the digital governance ecosystem in Estonia.

HIGHLIGHTS FROM TALLINN

Estonia, a European pioneer in digitalisation – provided the perfect setting to explore how e-governance can foster more open and accessible societies.

WHO PARTICIPATED?

Each partner delegation included **five young learners** (aged 24–29), **a project facilitator**, and a **local government representative**, all contributing to a dynamic and international learning environment.



MAIN ACTIVITIES:

- Guest lectures from experts on e-governance and digital transformation (Tallinn Education Department, TalTech.).
- Hands-on co-creation workshops, where participants designed innovative solutions for youth civic engagement and team presentations
- Site visits to Estonian institutions and organizations (Egovernance Academy, Estonian Parliament)
- Cultural exchange sessions, strengthening cooperation among participants from six European countries.

KEY RESULTS

- Enhanced digital and civic competences among 30 young participants.
- Young participants engaged and worked with 5 government officials
- Strengthened transnational collaboration and shared knowledge among partner countries.
- Increased understanding of how technology can improve transparency, inclusion, and youth participation in governance.
